
Update on Santa Fe Depot Project

City staff has been working with GH2 Architecture on the design of the roof rehabilitation project to preserve the historic Santa Fe Depot. The

City Commission recently awarded the construction bid in the amount of \$1,286,000 to Downey Contracting.

In compliance with the Oklahoma Municipal Budget Act (11 OS 17-201 et seq.) and the Shawnee City Code (Section 2-96), the City Manager develops an annual budget for review and approval by the City Commission.

To guide the budget development, the City approved Budgeting Policies in March 2022 and Capital Improvement Policies in December 2022. The City will also incorporate the citizen feedback provided through the 2023 Community Survey responses.
