

**CHAPTER FIVE
PLAN MAINTENANCE**

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MONITORING, EVALUATING, AND UPDATING PLAN

The Pottawatomie County Emergency Manager is the chairman of the PCHMPT and will be the primary person responsible for overseeing the Hazard Mitigation Plan and coordinating with the other jurisdictions where changes to their other planning mechanisms might enhance or interact with the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The plan will be monitored, evaluated and updated annually during the five-year cycle with the assistance of Pottawatomie County's contractor. This will also occur at any time there is a disaster in order to determine the effectiveness in or changes to programs that might affect mitigation priorities. Beginning on the fourth year, the Pottawatomie County Emergency Management Director will make all plan revisions final and submit the updated Hazard Mitigation Plan to the State of Oklahoma Hazard Mitigation Division. FEMA will review and approve six months before the end of the fifth year so that the jurisdictions will maintain eligibility.

The following individuals will be responsible for monitoring and evaluating the plan, mitigation activities, and coordinating with County Emergency Management:

 - **City of Maud - Emergency Management Director**
 - **City of McLoud - Emergency Management Director**
 - **Town of Pink - Mayor**
 - **Town of St. Louis - Mayor**

- **City of Shawnee - Emergency Management Director**
 - **City of Tecumseh - Emergency Management Director**
 - **Town of Tribbey - Mayor**
 - **Town of Wanette - Mayor**
- School Administrators for each public schools district and Gordon Cooper Technology Center.

The individuals listed above will perform any necessary monitoring site visits on a monthly basis and will also be the lead contact for phone calls, scheduling of meetings, and will:

- Monitor the hazard analysis for changes and additions;
- Monitor objectives and determine if they meet current and expected hazardous conditions;
- Determine if there are any implementation problems such as social, technical, administrative, political, legal, economic, and environmental or coordination issues with other agencies.

The individuals listed above will evaluate the Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan every year to determine the effectiveness and/or progress of mitigation actions and the implementation of other actions.

Items covered during the evaluation process should include:

- Evaluate magnitude of risk and determine if it has changed;
- Evaluate current resources and determine if they are appropriate for implementing mitigation actions;
- Determine if there were any implementation problems, such as technical, political, legal, or coordination issues with other agencies;
- Evaluate goals, objectives, and current or expected conditions;
- Evaluate how other agencies and partners have participated;
- Evaluate mitigation actions and determine if outcome occurred as expected:

- Was the intended purpose of the original mitigation action met?
- Was the mitigation action met in the proposed timeline?
- Did the listed agencies participate in the mitigation action?
- Did the mitigation action stay within the proposed budget?

The above listed individuals will perform site visits as needed on projects involving their jurisdictions and will work closely with the County Emergency Manager to monitor and evaluate the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Additionally, the Pottawatomie County Emergency Management Director will give the Pottawatomie County Commissioners an update report annually. The report will highlight the results of the previously mentioned activities. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

IMPLEMENTATION THROUGH EXISTING PROGRAMS

The County Emergency Management Director is responsible for overseeing updates to the Pottawatomie County Hazard Mitigation Plan. As such, the Emergency Management Director will also coordinate with other persons responsible for other plans in the county, cities, towns, public school districts and Gordon Cooper Technology Center. The Emergency Management Director will coordinate with county and city elected officials and school administrators to identify projects that could work toward meeting the goals of the Hazard Mitigation Plan and the jurisdictions participating in the plan. As the Hazard Mitigation Plan and other plans of the participating jurisdictions are updated the information deemed pertinent will be shared with the person / persons responsible for those plans.

Plans identified and reviewed during the planning development of the Hazard Mitigation Plan include:

Pottawatomie County

The Emergency Operations Plan, Floodplain Ordinances, and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed. Information from the Flood Insurance Rate Maps was used in the risk

assessment to help identify areas in the county that are at risk of flooding and in the development of projects for the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The County Emergency Management Director is responsible for monitoring/updating the Emergency Operations Plan and will integrate information from the Hazard Mitigation Plan as applicable into it along with any updates on an annual basis. Changes to the Emergency Operations Plan affecting the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be noted for consideration and incorporation at the five year update. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Asher

The Town of Asher has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Asher.

The Emergency Management Director for the Town of Asher will coordinate with the county emergency manager where additions or changes in the Town of Asher might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Asher will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Bethel Acres

Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed to determine locations within Bethel Acres at risk from flooding. Information was used to identify mitigation projects to mitigate the flooding hazard. No other plans are in place for consideration/inclusion in the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The Emergency Management Director for the Town of Bethel Acres will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of

Bethel Acres might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. They will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Brooksville

Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a risk hazard within the Town of Brooksville. No other plans are in place for consideration/inclusion in the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The Mayor of Brooksville will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of Brooksville might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. They will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Earlsboro

The Comprehensive Master Plan, Zoning Ordinances, and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed. Information from the Flood Insurance Rate Maps was used in the risk assessment to help identify areas in Earlsboro that are at risk of flooding and in the development of projects for the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Earlsboro is currently not a member of the NFIP and has no floodplain ordinances in place for consideration.

The Mayor of Earlsboro is responsible for monitoring/updating the Comprehensive Master Plan and will integrate information from the Hazard Mitigation Plan as applicable into it along with any updates at its normal update. Changes to the Comprehensive Master Plan affecting the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be noted for consideration and incorporation at the five year update. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Johnson

The Town of Johnson has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Johnson.

The Mayor of Johnson will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of Johnson might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Johnson will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Macomb

The Town of Macomb has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. The county Flood Insurance Rate Map was reviewed and it was determined that Macomb lies outside of the FEMA recognized Special Flood Hazard Area and flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Macomb.

The Mayor of Macomb will coordinate with the county emergency manager where additions or changes in the Town of Macomb might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Macomb will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

City of Maud

Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a risk hazard within the Town of Maud. No other plans are in place for consideration/inclusion in the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The Emergency Management Director for the City of Maud will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of Maud might

warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Maud will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

City of McLoud:

The Comprehensive Master Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, Economic Development Plan, Emergency Operation Plan, Storm water Management Plan, Building Codes, Zoning Ordinances, Subdivision Ordinances, Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and incorporated into the Hazard Mitigation Plan where applicable. Information from the aforementioned plans was used in the hazard analysis and in identifying mitigation projects to prepare for the hazards profiled in this plan that affect McLoud.

The Emergency Management Director for the City of McLoud is responsible for oversight in monitoring/updating the aforementioned plans and will integrate information from the Hazard Mitigation Plan as applicable into them along with any updates at their normally scheduled update. Changes to the aforementioned plans affecting the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be noted for consideration and incorporation at the five year update. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Pink

The Town of Pink has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Pink.

The Mayor of Pink will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of Pink might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Pink will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of St Louis

The Town of St. Louis has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of St. Louis.

The Mayor of St. Louis will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of St. Louis might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. St. Louis will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

City of Shawnee

The Comprehensive Master Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, Emergency Operation Plan, Building Codes, Zoning Ordinances, Subdivision Ordinances, Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and incorporated into the Hazard Mitigation Plan where applicable. Information from the aforementioned plans was used in the hazard analysis and in identifying mitigation projects to prepare for the hazards profiled in this plan that affect Shawnee.

The Emergency Management Director for the City of Shawnee is responsible for oversight in monitoring/updating the aforementioned plans and will integrate information from the Hazard Mitigation Plan as applicable into them along with any updates at their normally scheduled update. Changes to the aforementioned plans affecting the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be noted for consideration and incorporation at the five year update. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

City of Tecumseh

The Comprehensive Master Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, Economic Development Plan, Emergency Operation Plan, Zoning Ordinances, Subdivision Ordinances, Floodplain Ordinances and Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and incorporated into the

Hazard Mitigation Plan where applicable. Information from the aforementioned plans was used in the hazard analysis and in identifying mitigation projects to prepare for the hazards profiled in this plan that affect Tecumseh.

The Emergency Management Director for the City of Tecumseh is responsible for oversight in monitoring/updating the aforementioned plans and will integrate information from the Hazard Mitigation Plan as applicable into them along with any updates at their normally scheduled update. Changes to the aforementioned plans affecting the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be noted for consideration and incorporation at the five year update. The plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Tribbey

The Town of Tribbey has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Tribbey.

The Mayor of Tribbey will coordinate with the County Emergency Management Director where additions or changes in the Town of Tribbey might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Tribbey will continue to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Town of Wanette

The Town of Wanette has no other plans in place to consider in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Flood Insurance Rate Maps were reviewed and it was determined that flooding is not a hazard risk within the Town of Wanette.

The Mayor of Wanette will coordinate with the county emergency manager where additions or changes in the Town of Wanette might warrant changes applicable to the Hazard Mitigation Plan such as the addition or removal of action projects. Wanette will continue

to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Planning process and the plan will remain an active and relevant document with continued public participation.

Public School Districts/Gordon Cooper Technology Center

The public school districts as well as the Gordon Cooper Technology Center are governed by rules, regulations and laws of the State of Oklahoma. State statutes at Section 487.3. Emergency Preparedness Grants (74 O.S. § 51.2a) and (74 O.S. § 51.2b) provides that through the Department of Homeland Security grants, these learning institutions will be provided funding through grants to:

- Public schools, private schools, technology center schools, and institutions of higher learning in the State of Oklahoma to encourage greater emergency preparedness, including, but not limited to, improvement of plans and procedures for natural and man-made disaster and emergencies, improvement of security on campus, at events, and with regard to buses and other transportation, and improvement of communications strategies and equipment; and
- Local law enforcement, emergency management, disaster relief, and public health entities in the State of Oklahoma to encourage the active engagement of such entities with public schools, private schools, technology center schools, and institutions of higher learning in their efforts to improve emergency preparedness.

These institutions are tasked with preparing and maintaining planning mechanisms to provide enhanced preparedness and security for their campuses. These plans are updated on a yearly basis. In the planning process, their active hazard mitigation plan will be incorporated into other plans which meet state regulated criteria. Some of the plans are submitted through the Oklahoma Department of Education, while others are submitted and approved through the Department of Homeland Security. Information contained in all of the plans is inter-mingled to insure that all plans have common, updated data and directives. These plans will also be shared with the local emergency managers in order to assure that all relevant emergency agencies share the same guidance when responding

to emergencies or disasters.

Asher Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. In 2013, the school received a grant through the Pottawatomie County Sheriff's office to fund a school resource officer. The person in that position is assisting in updating and maintaining the various strategic safety plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans and is relevant to the schools would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects. The County Commissioner for this district is a very cooperative partner in school safety issues. The current mitigation project for the schools includes the renovation of part of the building to be rebuilt as school safe rooms. The school has gone out for bids to complete this project.

Bethel Acres Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects. The County Commissioner for this district is very proactive and maintains an awareness of any situations requiring action.

Dale Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects. The County Commissioner for this district is very pro-active and maintains an awareness of any situations requiring action. They rely on the County

Commissioner for debris management. The school cafeteria is designed as a safe room and is open to the community when school is not in session. A capital improvement bond issue is currently being used to fund upgrades at school facilities and could be amended for future projects as deemed feasible.

Earlsboro Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. The district plans to add a new cafeteria building using capital improvement bonds and would like to construct safe rooms as part of the construction. They are very interested in this hazard mitigation project as well as providing updates to existing facilities to improve tornado protection so that the facility could serve as a community shelter.

Grove Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects. The County Commissioner for this district is very proactive and maintains an awareness of any situations requiring action.

Macomb Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects.

Maud Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no issues which would create new mitigation projects.

McLoud Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. As indicated here, these plans were updated in 2013 – 2014. Integration with the HMP will occur during the 2015 updates.

North Rock Creek Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of these school plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular annual updates for all of the plans. As a result of hazard mitigation planning being integrated with other fiscal planning mechanisms, the school completed a school safe room project during 2012-2013.

Pleasant Grove Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of these school plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular annual updates for all of the plans. Because Ms. O'Donnell is new to the school this year (2015), she will be reviewing all of the plans, including this HMP. The school has been working with Oklahoma Emergency Management to conduct a Safe Schools 101 review. The school board has now set a date for a vote on a bond issue so that they can explore

their options for building a safe room, although they acknowledge the need for more than one safe room.

Shawnee Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of these school plans. This is done on an annual basis. A multi-departmental team coordinates with local emergency response officials to update the emergency plans annually. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular annual updates for all of the plans. As a result of hazard mitigation planning being integrated with other fiscal planning mechanisms, safe rooms were added during construction of the Junior High and Early Learning Center campuses.

South Rock Creek Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. The Superintendent is new and is in the process of revising the Emergency Operations Plan for the district. Any integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. These other plans were reviewed and there are currently no information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be issues which would create new mitigation projects.

Tecumseh Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. The primary current project is to request funding for school safe rooms.

Wanette Public Schools

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard

Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. The School Superintendent is new at this time and is beginning a review of all of the plans.

Gordon Cooper Technology Center

The School Superintendent is responsible for the maintenance and updating of the schools plans. This is done on an annual basis. Any information common to the Hazard Mitigation Plan and these plans would be integrated during the regular updates for all of the plans. The school's safety program provides outreach capability to business and industry in the community for the distribution of hazard information and best practices. School facilities are used for hazard mitigation planning team meetings and for other meetings/training activities of the emergency management department.
